### 1st Vice Report

Greetings Comrades, I hope you had a great Easter! Can you believe it's already April? Our Membership as of April First is 93%.

Membership in the American Legion as a Legionnaire is reserved exclusively for those who have served their country in time of war. The dates listed below are mandated by the United States Congress in the charter they have granted to the American Legion. You must have been an active member in one of the five branches of service (or the Merchant Marine) for the period specified. And have an Honorable Discharge to be eligible to become a member. Membership Eligibility Dates or

April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918 December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946 June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955 February 28 to May 7, 1975 August 24, 1982 to July, 1984 December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990 August 2, 1990 to cessation of hostilities

Proof of service is normally established by either a DD-214 showing your period of service, with an Honorable Discharge, or an Active Duty ID card. The dues for this year are as follows; if you are 70 years old or older and have been a continuous member of the American Legion for 5 years or longer your dues are \$29.00, for all others dues are \$40.00.
