As always, new members, as well as transfers, are welcome. If you know anyone that meets the eligibility criteria to join invite them out to see what we are all about. I can tell you from traveling around the 5th District and the Department we are a busy post with a lot going on. We have a lot to offer in ways of programs and events.

Membership in the American Legion as a Legionnaire is reserved exclusively for those that have served honorably. The dates listed below are mandated by the United States Congress in the charter they have granted the American Legion. You must have been an active member in one of the five branches of service (or the Merchant Marine for the period specified) and have an HONORABLE Discharge to be eligible to become a member. The dates are as follows:

- · April 6th 1917 November 11th, 1918
- . December 7th, 1941 PRESENT "Until a time later determined by the Federal Government ".

Proof of service is normally established by either a DD-214 showing your period of service, or an Active Duty ID card. The dues for the year are as follows; if you are 70

years old or older and have been a member of post 283 for a minimum of 5 years **consecutively** your dues are \$29.00. For everyone else dues are \$40.00.

Post Service Officer Report

On January 1, 2020, the Blue Water Navy Act of 2019 goes into effect. Did you or someone you know serve in the offshore waters of Vietnam between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975? If so then you are considered Blue Water Navy. There are 14 conditions related to the exposure with some of these being Type 2 diabetes, Parkinson's disease, many forms of cancer and others. In addition, if you're a Veteran who served in the Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) between September 1, 1967 and August 31, 1971 you may also qualify. Please get the word out to our Veterans. Have them contact me for more information.

Veterans Benefits Administration officials have sent out letters to more than 77,000 veterans whose past disability claims connected to Agent Orange exposure have been denied. Those individuals will have to refile with the department next year if they want their cases reconsidered.

The Office of Management and Budget has delayed the VA's decision to include bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinson's-like symptoms as presumptive conditions. The decision was challenged by the OMB and the White House by challenging scientific evidence and recommendations by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine. More than 83,000 Vietnam Veterans have these conditions and would be eligible for disability compensation and health care if their conditions are included.

As I said as the $3^{\rm rd}$ Vice, I hope everyone had a great holiday and a wonderful 2020. Remember those active duty who can't be home this holiday and celebrate as we can.
